

Sleeping and Food

Accommodations in Mexico, Puerto Rico, and Texas are typically on the floor in a gated church close to where you will be during the day. In Mexico, Rainbow Trail provides the food that the group will prepare each day. Bottled water and ice are provided to meet drinking, cooking, and cleaning needs.

In Puerto Rico and in Texas, each day the cook group will shop for food at a local grocery store and then the cook-group prepares the meals while the devotion group plans for devotions.



I'm Interested! Now What?...



Rainbow Trail's three Bridging Borders programs are charter group opportunities. If your congregation's youth group is small and cannot meet the minimum participant number or if there is one individual who would like to register, you can register with another congregation or call the camp office and we will try to match you with another congregation. Mexico and Puerto Rico are designed for a maximum one or two congregational leaders and 10 or 11 kids for a total of 12 participants. Hurricane Relief has a minimum of 12 people with a maximum of 36.

Registrations are now available and will be considered on a first call, first serve basis.

Mexico: \$570 per person

Puerto Rico: \$570 per person + airfare

Hurricane Relief: \$595 per person

Cost includes meals, travel, lodging, materials, RTALC staff, and insurance.
